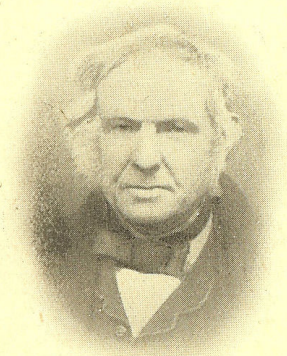

The Origin of the Firm

Four Generations of Screen Makers

THE firm of THOMAS LOCKER AND Co., LIMITED, of WARRINGTON, goes back in origin to 1878, and ever since then has been very closely interwoven with the history of the Wire-Weaving industry.

The founder, and the prime source of the firm's inspiration, was the late Mr. Thomas Locker, who was everywhere recognised as a leading pioneer in the industry; but *his* father before him was the first man to weave wirecloth by power, a method of manufacture which had a revolutionary effect throughout the entire trade.

The founder was succeeded by his two sons, Mr. James T. Locker and Mr. Thomas Locker, who acted as joint Managing Directors until 1926. (The firm had been converted into a Limited Company in 1899.)

Ald. Jas. T. Locker was Mayor of Warrington from 1923 to 1925. On his death, his son, Mr. T. C. Locker, was appointed joint Managing Director with Mr. Thomas Locker, and Mr. J. R. Locker became Secretary.
